Poster Presentation Guidelines

As part of the event and to promote engagement we will holding a paper competition on the topic of “Advances in understanding of Mercia Mudstone”.

There will be two categories judged in the competition:

- Lead author has less than 10 years of ground engineering industry experience
- Lead author has more than 10 years of ground engineering industry experience

Prizes of £100, £50 and £25 will be awarded at the close of the seminar for the best three posters in each category, as judged by those chairing the seminar sessions.

Please read the following guidelines and information to facilitate the successful delivery of your poster presentation.

Display of Posters

Posters will be displayed on boards in the Chemical Engineering (Y11, first floor open space atelier).

Poster authors should set their posters up on arrival. Poster boards and fixings will be available on arrival. The posters will remain on display for the entire conference so that delegates have maximum opportunity to read them.

Creating your poster presentation

Posters maximize your opportunity to interact with conference participants. Please read the following guidelines and information before you begin to create your poster presentation. Please plan carefully the design and presentation of your poster to make sure that it stands out as an attractive and informative presentation. You want to be certain that the 'reader' of the poster comes away with a clear understanding of your research.

Poster Size

- A1 (594 x 841 mm 23.4 x 33.1 in).
- Portrait or landscape is acceptable.

Format

- Poster presentations are hard-copy (paper/poster) format only.
- Posters must fit within the designated display area.
- The most successful and attractive posters are graphically produced posters that highlight and summarize the main points, with the poster presenter filling in the details.

Your poster presentation should include:

- The paper title and all authors at the top of the poster.
- A brief introduction, main body of the subject, conclusions, and references (make sure this information is presented in a logical and clear sequence).
- Captions or explanations for graphs, pictures, and tables.
- The content of your poster should not contain any overt advertising or promotion. The posters are intended to be informative and provide the audience with an honest and balanced view on the subject of the presentation.

Font Sizes (minimum recommendations)

- Title: 36 point type.
- List of authors: 24 point type.
- Double-spaced text: 18 point type.
- The entire poster layout should be readable from two metres away.

At the end of the conference please remember to take your poster. Any posters not cleared will be destroyed.
